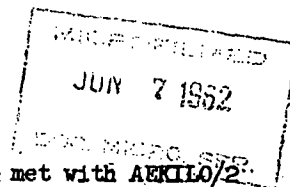

MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, SR/2

SUBJECT : Contact Report - AEKIL0/2



1. On 15 June 1960 Case Officer [] met with AEKIL0/2 for purpose of collecting REDSKIN leads and information on Latvia. The meeting was arranged per telephone call to Subject at 2130 hours on 14 June 1960. Case Officer met AEKIL0/2 in the lobby of the Sheraton - Hotel (Seventh Ave and 55th Street) in New York at approximately 1145 hours. He escorted him to Room 1416 at the Hotel Victoria (Seventh Ave and 51st Street) where the debriefing took place.

2. Initial discussions concerned materials received from AEKIL0/2

a. Additions to the Central Committee of the Latvian Communist Party plus members of the Revision Commission of the Latvian Communist Party. (Attachment A)

b. Officials of the Latvian Trade Unions. (Attachment B)

c. Officials of the Latvian Komsomol. (Attachment C) Among these officials are #74, M. TALS, the world chess champion and #81, Maigonis VALDMANIS, the captain of the Soviet Men's Basketball Team which visited the United States in November - December 1959. (Attachment D)

d. Information regarding Elza ZEBPANSKA, the Latvian diva from New York, who is currently visiting relatives in Latvia, was received. (Attachment E) This is her second annual trip. Heretofore she has not proven to be of proper caliber for selection as a REDSKIN candidate. Upon her return it is recommended that someone from OO/C should debrief her. One interesting aspect reported by Subject was the fact that she had been assisted by Teo KRUMS, approximate age 60-70, a photographer and film representative, from New York in obtaining her visa. How he assisted her was not known. Once in Latvia Elza ZEBRANSKA assisted KRUMS in obtaining a visa. Subject was asked to learn more, if possible, as to how these parties assisted one another in obtaining visas.

e. Subject recommended as potential REDSKIN travelers Ivars KALME and Edwin MEDNIS, American chess players of Latvian descent, who in July 1960 will go to Leningrad under auspices

of State to compete in a chess tourney. (Attachment F)
Unfortunately both of these individuals have manifested no
interest in a REDSKIN mission as a result of contact and
assessment already conducted by SR/2/Baltic Case Officers

f. Addresses of seven former Latvian Army officers now
residing in Latvia were received. (Attachment G) Peteris
KVALBERGS and Peteris BOKALDERS are believed to have returned
from deportation in the past two years. BOKALDERS may have
a wife and son in the United States. AEKILO/2 will endeavor
to find out where. There might be a REDSKIN potential here.

g. A list of three Latvians who emigrated to the United States
from Latvia in the past 3 or 4 weeks was received. (Attachment
H) Marta KELEERA one of the individuals who came out in early
May 1960 is the wife of a former Latvian military attache in
Leningrad. She may possess some worthwhile information about
Jelgava area where she lived the past 20 years. A sister still
remains in Jelgava. Marta KELEERA is living with a brother,
Dr. ZEMERA, in Duluth, Minnesota. Through OO/C some of these
people might profitably be debriefed for information regarding
their past environment and observations.

h. A list of Latvian youth leaders in Canada was received.
(Attachment I)

i. A list of Latvian leaders of American - Latvian Youth
Association in Canada and United States. (Attachment J)

j. Names of two Latvian Boy Scout leaders in Australia were
furnished. (Attachment K)

k. Addresses of 19 selected Latvian youths who might be
potential REDSKIN travelers for the future. (Attachment L)

l. Bio information on a couple recommended for a REDSKIN mission
was received. Until their citizenship is finally granted they
cannot be seriously considered. (Attachment M)

3. AEKILO/2 gave Case Officer several publications including four
copies of Baltic Review (#16-19) - April, July, November 1959 and February
1960; an article entitled "The Soviet Occupation and Incorporation of Latvia;"
June 17 - August 5, 1940, published by Baltic Review Publishers, New York,
1957; an article entitled "British Policy Towards the Baltic States 1918-1920"
by Edgar Anderson, from Journal of Central European Affairs, Vol XIX, No. 111,
October 1959; a copy of the recent Manifesto citing the Twentieth Anniversary
of Soviet Aggression against the Baltic States. (Attachment N); and a Study
of Conditions in POW and Concentration Camps in USSR. (Attachment O)

4. Subject will be in Indianapolis, Indiana 2-3 July 1960 to attend the Latvian song festival. He will endeavor to pick up further REDSKIN leads and to contact some of the Latvian Catholic Youth Organizations.

5. A new sterile phone number DI 7-3720 was furnished to Subject. |

6. The sum of \$2.35 was paid to Subject to reimburse him for two telephone calls from New York to Headquarters. A receipt is in Subject's file.

7. Next meeting will take place upon initiation of contact by Case Officer near end of July. However, Subject may be in Washington area during July and time permitting will contact Case Officer relative to any information he may have at that time.

8. Subject's efforts to supply REDSKIN leads as well as information on Latvian leaders and the Latvian immigration continues to be useful. He understands his role as a consultant and tries to oblige. |

9. Case Officer and Subject left Hotel Victoria at approximately 1330 hours and went to the Grill Room at the Hotel Taft (51st and Seventh Ave). At 1415 hours Case Officer left Subject in vicinity of Hotel Victoria. No surveillance was detected at any time.

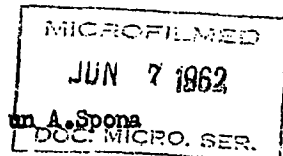

Michaels TALS -- Editor of the Riga Chess Journal "Shakhmat" (cir-

ulation of 5,000). Born 9 November 1936 in Riga. At the beginning of the war, he and his parents left for the Urals. His father worked there as a doctor in a hospital. He does not mention his father now, but his mother was with him in Moscow, when M. T. played in the world tournament with Botvinnik.

Even as a child, Tals had a remarkable photographic memory. He is able, after a simultaneous playing session, to remember and replay all 30 or 40 games.

He graduated from secondary school at the age of 15 (he finished the first 3 grades in one year), and then graduated from the Philosophical Faculty of Riga University. He likes serious work. He is never seen taking a rest. In his writings and speeches M. Tals does not call himself a Russian, usually a "native of Riga." He speaks Latvian fluently, but with a Russian accent. He is Jewish by nationality.

In 1953, M. T. became chess champion of the Latvian SSR, in 1957 USSR champion for the first time and in 1958 for the second time. In 1960 he became world champion.

His diploma thesis for the History and Philosophy Faculty was on the subject "Satire in the Novel 'Twelve Chairs' by Il'f and Petrov.

M. VALDMANIS, about 30 years old, basketball captain of Latvia and USSR.

As far as is known, he is also the "politruk" of these teams.

The two above mentioned persons frequently travel abroad to participate in tournaments.

Elza ZEBRANSKA, soprano; born 1 August 1903. Studied voice in Riga, and later (after 1929) in Paris with Kurganova. In 1933-1934 she sang in Paris with the Russian Opera troupe and studied in the Russian Conservatory and the Ecole Normale de Musique, in both cases with Kedrova. After finishing her studies, she sang in several French concert halls. From 1935-1939 she taught at the Latvian Conservatory in Riga. She gave performances in Stockholm in 1935, Moscow and Leningrad in 1937, and 1937-1938 in New York. She has lived in the US since 1939. From 1940-1942 she sang at the Metropolitan and other opera companies; from 1946 to 1947 she gave guest performances with the Russian Opera troupe in San Francisco. For a while she had her own voice studio in New York. Since 1954 she has again resumed concert tours. She has great natural talent, outstanding voice qualities, and an exceptional feeling for music. She has also given concerts in the Latvian Society in the US, and has made recordings.

She visited Latvia in spring and summer of 1959 and since the end of April 1960. She gave two concerts in Riga, on 12 May 1960 in the Riga Opera House and on 21 May 1960 in the auditorium of the Latvian University.

On 5 June [1960] the Riga Radio Station made the following broadcast:

"Last year, the well-known Latvian singer Elza Zebranska visited her homeland after an absence of many years. Before leaving, the artist promised to return in 1960 and give a concert for our music lovers. She has now been back for a whole month and during this time has given two concerts. Elza Zebranska's concerts attracted both the old admirers of her talent, who witnessed the artist's triumph in Riga after more than 20 years, and the young people who had only heard about this famous singer. Already after the first concert there were flowers, flowers and flowers, and many heartfelt congratulations. With each new number, the listeners were convinced that Elza Zebranska is really a high-class artist with great feeling and a dynamic personality. The style and depth of feeling in her interpretation of classical, as well as American and Latvian composers' songs, brought forth unanimous, warm applause from the audience.

Our reporter visited the artist in a Riga hotel and recorded the following conversation on tape:

"Honored Artist, how does it feel to be back in Latvia again this year?"--"Thank You, I feel fine. When I came last year, I did not know what I would find and what was awaiting me here, but this year I already knew that I would receive a friendly welcome and that I would see everything blossoming and thriving not only in the gardens and parks, but also in the life of the people. Yes, life changes

quickly here; even looking down from the airplane one can see the scaffolding of new construction projects and the new white buildings sparkling in the sun. It makes my heart happy to see all this. What better feeling can there be? To be happy for one's homeland - that is just wonderful."

"I understand you and I am glad that our new construction projects give you this feeling. However, I would like to know how well you are satisfied with the concerts you have given in Riga."

"To say that I am very well satisfied would be far too little. I am more than delighted. It is true that I was very, very nervous during my first concert at the Opera. I had not given a concert in that hall for 20 years and I did not know how the audience would receive me, and whether I would be able to have any contact with them. The fact remains: giving a concert in my native land, for the people of my native city, made me very excited and brought tears to my eyes. Well, it is quite natural that this excitement had an effect on the concert performance. However, the main thing is: I saw how the audience responded, I saw that they understood me and felt with me. This reassured me and during my second concert in the University Auditorium I really felt wonderful. I believe you and my listeners will understand from what I said that I am better satisfied with the second concert than with the first one. I had a wonderful response from the audience even at the first concert in the Opera, but that cannot be compared with the response and friendliness shown by the

audience at the concert in the University Auditorium. Any artist could be proud of such audience appreciation. And flowers, flowers, -- I received whole armfuls of them."

"I suppose the concert performances were a great mental strain for you. Have you had a rest since then? "

"Two weeks have passed since the last concert. I had caught a cold and had to get medical treatment. And, you know, here again I have to say that this is very good here. Wonderful, good doctors, very kind to their patients, attention, care and medicines. I had been told in America that these [the latter] are lacking here, but I have found out just the opposite."

"Do you feel quite well now? "

"Yes, completely. I am getting ready to go to the seashore to spend the summer there and get a good rest. "

"Are you thinking of giving another concert in your homeland before your return to your present place of residence?"

"I must say that I have thought about it. "

According to Latvian newspapers, the US team going to Moscow for the chess tournament includes two Latvian chess players.

Edmars MEDNIS, about 25 years old; parents' address (he probably lives there too) -- 76-10 34th Ave., Jackson Heights 72, N. Y., Tel. HI 6-0232. There are two sisters in the family (probably both students or in the last grade of high school). His father is a Latvian Lieutenant-Colonel, a writer and journalist. He graduated from the University in Latvia. His mother works (as far as I know) as a trained nurse or in a similar capacity.

Edmars Mednis has finished his studies and is probably an engineer. He has played before in the US chess team (the students' team).

Ivars KALME, also about 25 years old (or younger). Lives and works in Philadelphia. His father was a public prosecutor in Latvia (Karceviskis, later changed his name to Kalme).

Ivars KALME is well known among US chess players. Several years ago he won in the Latvian chess tournament.

The tournament is to take place in Leningrad (not in Moscow, as previously mentioned), and it will be during the period between 16 July and 2 August 1960.

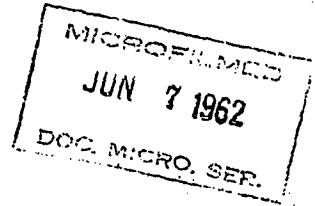

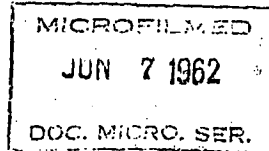

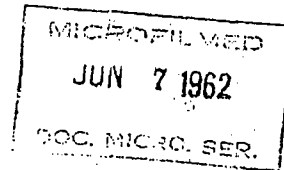
