MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, SR/2

SUBJECT

Operational Meeting - Case Officer and Vilis HAZNERS

- 1. On 28 March 1960 Case Officer received a letter from Vilis HAZNERS wherein the latter stated that he would be available for a meeting any time between 28 March 1 April 1960 inclusive. Purpose of this meeting was to provide the Case Officer with the results of a trial mission previously given to Subject upon recruitment. Moreover, Case Officer would have an opportunity to elicit information relative to potential legal travellers and possible leads to future assets within Latvia.
- 2. Case Officer arranged by telephone to meet Subject in New York, New York on 1 April 1960. Subject was notified subsequently by phone to come to the lobby of the Park Sheraton Hotel, 55th St. and 7th Avenue, New York, New York at 1000 hours. Having checked for surveillance Case Officer met Subject and escorted him to Room 432 where a debriefing took place.
 - 3. In response to a trial mission Subject furnished following data:
 - a. Membership of the present Latvian Government (Attachment A). Subject has BI on the members which might be useful to confirm what is known or to provide additional material on any of these people should they become the target of any PP activity.
 - b. Lesding members of the Latvian CP. (Attachment B.) BI is available such as described in a above. Subject stated that brother of First Secretary, A. J. PEISE, lives in New York City. He believes that mother is there as well. A. J. PEISE allegedly left U.S. circa 1915 to study in Soviet Union at Lenin Institute and chose to remain there. In 1940, he went to Latvia. During cit subsequent Soviet evacuation of the country he went back to the USSR, but returned to Latvia in 1945.

c. Requested BI was furnished on three individuals who are of current operational interest to the Latvian desk. Subject's friendship with AEMARSH/15, and Jekab SILIS has been known for some time, but to what degree Subject has been first write of knowledgeable of their activities has not been known. Leteris Janeloins

AEMAISE/15 who was formerly married to a niete/of Subject's wife is a Swedish citizen. His first wife, Ains BUNDZA now remarried to MAUGHA, fou is either a dentist or pharmacist living inariga. She has reprents and a brother living in Valka. The second wife is Velta ROGA (nee) KANERS. This woman divorced her husband, ROGA, fou who now resides in the U.S.A. or Canada. Aija, a daughter by Velta's first husband, lives with her. Peteris, a son by AEMARSH/15 is about 11 years old. Velta's father, age 70, a former Latvian army colonel lives with her. At one time he was secretary to the Minister of War in Latvia. Subject believes that AEMARSH/15 and wife could make a trip to Latvia. (Note: This is highly improbable since AEMARSH/15 is pretty well known to RIS.)

Jekab SILIS wrote Subject via VOA approximately a year ago giving a Riga address c/o Erika SVARCS, Karla Marksa iela 10/12 Apt. 2, Riga, Latvia who is possibly a relative of SILIS's wife. True address is Altonovas iela, 85, Riga, Latvia. SILIS does not wish to have mail or visits at the latter. Moreover, he does not welcome letters from outside the USSR sent to his accommodation address. Subject stated that he lived in Riga on same block as SILIS before World War II.

d. Names of responsible, mature Latvians in various countries who might serve as spotters for legal travellers (Attachment F). These individuals are active in Latvian youth activities.

One of the names given is Imants REITMANIS who according to Subject is in the employ of the Danish Intelligence Service. This individual's Danish Intelligence contact is allegedly a Danish Naval Officer whom Subject has met. Subject will furnish name at next meeting. (Case Officer probed again to determine whether, Subject has worked for DIS or BIS. A hint to this effect was supplied by _____at one time. Subject denies same.)

In Sweden the daughter of Karlis DZILLEJA, age 30, is recommended as an active leader among Latvian youth. Voldemars of Vladislaws VAUNZIAS heads the Swedish branch of the Latvian Veterans Organization, "Daugavas Vanagi," which sends a type of "Care" package to its former comrades in Latvia on a continuing basis. He is a graduate of both Latvian and Swedish Universities. Approximately 40 years of age. He actively participates in Latvian youth activities. In 1959 his parents succeeded in emigrating to Sweden.

In Germany, Janis CIRULIS, approximately 40-45 years of age, a former Latvian Army captain, has considerable contact with Latvian youth. He is the chief of the German Information Office of "Daugavas Vanagi." He has worked for a U.S. Army Labor Service Company in Kaiserslautern. Adolfs SILDE, approximately 50 years of age, is a jurist. He is a strong anti-Communist writer. Two of his older children who are doctors work with Latvian youth. SILDE is a member of the Assembly of Captive European Nations.

One of the names given as a possible contact with Latvian youth in England is Augusts ABAKUKS, approximately 45 years of age, who is probably in communication with the British Intelligence Service. Another is Janis ENSYALDIS about age 40. He is chief of the Information Office of the English branch of "Daugavas Vanagi." He is a "very good friend" of Subject beginning with their school days in Jelgava.

In Canada, Bruno HUBESS, age 36, is the former chairman of the Latvian Youth Festival which was held in Toronto in 1959. His activity among Latvian youth extends to the U.S. as well. Subject who will visit Canada o/a 28 May 1960 will see RUBESS and will try to spot likely traveller leads.

One of Australia's active Latvian youth leaders is Janis LIEPINS. He is chairman of the Information Office of the Australian branch of "Daugavas Vanagi." Subject cited the potential value of the famous swimmers Ilse and John KONRADS as possibly future legal travellers from Australia. Their age makes them unsuitable at this time but their fame in the sports world is well established.

In the United States Subject recommends Edgars TENIKIS, Edgars TENIKIS and Juris SIESERS as possible contacts for spotting Tatvian youth as potential travellers. Edgars PENIKIS is a conservationist (forester). He is chairman of the Information Office of "Daugavas Vanagi" in the United States. One of his three children is a doctor who might be suitable traveller. TREIMANIS, an engineer, is chairman of "Daugavas Vanagi" in Boston. He is active in the Latvian Boy Scout movement. SIESERS, an electrical engineer, is chairman of the Latvian Youth Association in America.

4. From a discussion of the active Latvia youth leaders outlined in d above, Case Officer proceeded to develop other leads as to potential travellers. Subject stated that a former army comrade Ervins KILPE had recently returned from Siberia to Latvia in September 1959. He is living inAriga, with relatives. KILPE's wife, however who is a dentist at a VA hospital lives at 12 West Deyton Drive, Fairborn, Chio. One son (age 27 or 28), 1/Lt. Gunars KILPE, 074305, Co. "C" 168th Eng. Eu. (C), APO 46, New York, New York is married and is stationed in Germany. He is expected to return to the United States in the spring of 1960 for graduate study. Another son, fnu, age 23 or 24, is a medical student in St. Louis, Missouri. He formerly spent two years at De Pauw in Greencastle, Indiana. In July, Subject will attend a Latvian Song Festival in Indianapolis, Indiana. At that time he will have an opportunity, if so advised, to learn more about the mother and the medical student. Together they might be future Baltic travellers who have a desire to see their respective husband and parent. The medical student will be investigated as to his suitability to travel in a witting role. 308 circa 1934 ext USA .

Another lead is Jaris JAUNTIKANS 5928 N. Park Avenue, Philadelphia 4, Pennsylvania, LIVINGSTON 9-1952. He is approximately 25 years of age.

Subject furnished name MEDNIS, fnu, a Latvian who was formerly a student in Berlin University, as a potential traveller. This individual is known to SILDE in paragraph 3 \underline{d} above.

- 5. Subject's PRO I was reviewed relative to an explanation of the alias Aleksandrs SILENIEKS. Subject stated that he used this pseudonym in the Latvian underground in 1941 and in his role as a journalist.
- 6. Conversation was then turned towards a discussion of what Subject knew regarding RIS sponsored writing, e.g. "Return to Homeland", from Latvia and elsewhere directed at emigres. Did Subject regard this writing as an effective propaganda means? What, if anything, did Subject know concerning its espionage character?

Subject stated that the "Return to Homeland" campaign is Soviet sponsored from Berlin. It originated in 1951 or 1953. Its propaganda reaches more Latvians in Canada then in the United States. This is due to the relative ease with which the Soviets have been able to acquire 60% - 70% of the addresses of Latvians in Canada, 80% of which reside in the Toronto area. Regardless of the dissemination Subject believes that Soviet propaganda aimed at Latvians is not especially effective.

With respect to espionage Subject claims to have no information. He was directed to look for any information regarding Latvian communists in the U.S. and abroad who are known to be active agents. (Case Officer has been advised to beware of emigre denunciations which are not founded on fact.) Subject asserted that there is a Latvian CI center in Australia. There is a center in Canada, he believes, for suspect Latvian Canadians only. Subject claims to have a contact with a man in Canada who might be able to identify suspected Communists and agents.

7. Once having broached matter of RIS, Subject recounted several instances of espionage involving Latvians. One such case involved FRIEDENBERGS, fruu a former Latvian jurist in Australia who created a scandal among the emigres as a result of his association with an RIS representative in the country. Subject has material on this incident.

In 1955 while Subject was in Germany a Latvian sea captain, adolfs ALBATS, arrived there. Subject met him. Individual posed as an active anti-Communist among the Latvians. Later Subject received a letter from the Latvian Embassy in London denouncing individual as an agent. ALBATS subsequently admitted that he had been recruited and trained. He later wrote a book on his association with the RIS. (Subject has a copy available for Case Officer.) According to the author 10% of all Baltic Germans have been recruited prior to repatriation. ALBATS according to Subject was the last German harbor commander of Liepaja prior to capitulation. Presently he lives in Alamburg and is now a German citizen.

As a follow up to the discussion on ALBATS, Subject was queried relative to \Box a Latvian sea captain of recent operational interest. Subject denied knowledge of individual.

Subject tried to recall a case of espionage involving Latvians which took place in Augsburg in 1955. At that time he met a brother and sister who ran a shop there. The sister and mother had come recently from Latvia. The woman was later exposed as an RIS agent, arrested and deported by the German authorities. Subject will furnish name at next meeting. An Agency representative investigated this, Subject claims. He does not recall latter a name. It appears to Case Officer that Subject has in mind the case of Barring. The Agency representative was probably a who concurrently furnished BI on Subject at that time.

- 8. Subject stated that the files of Committee for a Free Latvia contain interviews with Latvian refugees in Germany which Subject conducted while there.
- 9. With respect to Subject's visits to England while in Germany Subject denies recruitment by BIS. He claims to have gone to London 7 or 8 times on matters regarding "Daugavas Vanagi". There are about 2,000 members there with 30 branches of the organization. Subject visited these extensively. He claims that as a former Boy Scout he even called on the late Lord Böden-Powell.
- 10. In an attempt to learn something about existing card files on former Latvian veterans who are trustworthy, Subject asserted that all Latvian Veterans in the U.S. are carded (approximately 1,600 names). These files are kept in Chicago. Subject further volunteered that Latvian organizations in the U.S. have files on 12,000 out of 60,000 Latvians in this country.
- 11. Subject's correspondence is extensive as evidenced by the names he has in an address book which he carries. (Would that we had that book.) Subject claims that he does not use a code when writing to friends inside Latvia, but rather uses a pseudonym, Arvids HANSONS, and his home address, 4 Summit St., E. Orange, New Jersey. He has written two letters to his

Subject's wife corresponds with her mother, Valley BUNDZA, Rigas 1ela 53 Luju'a (75) Mariya (Walter may be accommodation-address and mother's name Mariya)

With respect to mail censorship Subject believes that it is physically citation impossible for Soviets to check more than 1 out of 10 letters. At Christmas time 1956 or 1957 Riga Radio allegedly claimed that over a 1/2 million letters from the were handled by the Riga Post Office.

"Daugavas Vanagi" during past year between mid-October and mid-December collected funds to send \$40,000 in packages to Latvia. One half of this sum was collected in the United States.

- 12. Subject was queried regarding his evaluation of Radio Madrid. He feels that it is doing a good job.
- 13. Case Officer inquired about FRIEDRICHSON, fnu, a latvian Army officer, courtmartialed for Soviet espionage in the 1930's. Subject stated that this individual was called FREDRICH. [He is probably not identical with the accommodation address of
- 14. Subject stated that he had no knowledge of Latvian informants on the eve of the Soviet occupation in July 1940. He claims that out of 2,000 officers' files which passed through his hands in response to a Soviet questionaire on their attitudes only 2 admitted to being pro-Soviet.
- 15. While a member of the latvian Legion in the German Army Subject could only identify one Latvian Individual that he knew definitely, to be an intelligence officer. [Rudolf Furks] (now living in New York) was a member of the Sicherheitdienst.
- 16. Subject attended a dinner in Germany, exact date unknown, with LIEPINS, fnu, a former latvian Minister of Finance, now a Latvian representative to the German Government, who introduced him to an American who inquired extensively about Subject's interviews with refugees from Latvia. LIEPINS now lives in Ludwigsburg. He has 6 children. One daughter is married to a U.S. officer. He is known to SILDE cited in paragraph 3 c above.
- 17. Subject has recently learned that Janis/HUNTE, a former army colleague, is back in Riga. He was imprisoned probably in 1944 by the Soviets.
- 18. Arrangements for a subsequent meeting were discussed. Subject will be available 25-28 April. If necessary, Case Officer will contact Subject at his home by a person-to-person call. Subject will be in Washington area 29-30 April.

19. Case Officer cautioned Subject that he must not under any circumstances furnish any leads to his correspondents that might in any way tie him in with a role on behalf of an AIS. The meeting adjourned at 1330 hours. Case Officer accompanied Subject to lobby entrance. No surveillance was observed as he left the immediate area.

PETERES JANELSINS -- about 42 years of age. Swedish subject. Born, for raised and educated in Latvia. In 1939 (or possibly 1938), graduated from Latvian Military School. Career officer. During the Latvian independence period, he served in the 6th Riga Infantry Regiment. During World War II, he served in the police and in the Latvian Legion. His last rank was that of Adjutant of Fusilier Battalion, 1st Latvian Division (according to German numeration, 15th Division). After the capitulation (May 1945), he went to Denmark, from where he moved to Sweden in the fall of 1945. He has lived in Stockholm for a long time. Address: Scdermannsgatan 27/II, telephone Stockholm 419636. Mailing address: Post Box 11040, Stockholm 11. 5 cc.

Marital Status: Has been married twice. The first time in 1941 (or 1942) to Aina Reuska. Was divorced from her in 1943 (or 1944). Aina Rauska came from a well-known Latvian family of book and newspaper publishers in Northern Vidzeme (Valka). She remained in Latvia; now living in Riga; has remarried; her address and new married name are not known. She is not in contact with relatives and acquaintances in the West (or in Latvia); she is probably afraid of becoming suspect to the Communist occupation regime. She works in Riga as a dentist (or pharmaceutist). Graduated from the Latvian University in Riga under the Communist regime. Her parents live in Valka; her oldest brother perished during World War II in Latvia. Her youngest brother was a lieutenant in the Latvian Legion

(supply officer); during the final days of the war he fled to Sweden, from where he was turned over to the Russians (probably in the winter of 1946). However, as far as it is known, he has not been in prison or in a labor camp. Is married and lives in Valka (?).

The second wife - Velta Roga, nee Kaneps. Her first husband was a veterinarian by the name of Roga, who served during World War II as a veterinary officer in the Latvian Legion. He is now either in the US or in Canada. She has a daughter, Aija, from her first marriage, who lives with the Janelsins family in Stockholm; she is about 14 or 15 years old. From her second marriage (with Janelsins) she has a son, Peteris, about 11 years old.

Janelsins' wife, Velta, comes from a Latvian officers' family. Her father was a colonel in the Latvian Army and for many years secretary to the Minister of War. Her mother died (probably in 1955) in Stockholm. Colonel Kaneps is living with the Janelsins family, he is quite elderly (over 70) and in poor health. Velta J. belonged to some Latvian youth resistance group during the Russian occupation period and was arrested. She is strongly anti-Communist, intelligent and extremely energetic. If I am not mistaken, she works as a schoolteacher in Stockholm.

Peter J.'s father died while he [the son] was still young. His mother lived in Riga until 1956 (probably); then she was allowed to go to her son in Sweden. After about 6 months she went to live in the US. She is staying

with her daughter Veronika and her son-in-law, Anslavs Eglitis. Their last address is: 1298 Monument St., Pacific Pälisades, California.

Veronika Janelsins and her husband, Anslavs Eglitis, are well-known Latvian artists; Veronika is a painter and Anslavs is a writer and painter, as well as a journalist:

P. Janelsins' mother is a very active lady, about 70 years old.

Characteristics of P.J.

Very enterprising. Self-assured and sometimes overly smart; as a result, he has few frields. Intelligent and active. Hobbies: travel, photography, motorcycles [or automobiles?] (in Latvian 1 'Spēkrati'). Loves the outdoors and hunting. Whatever he undertakes, he does with enthusiasm and with an intelligent approach. He has good, reliable friends in Latvia. He speaks Latvian and Swedish fullently, and probably knows Russian fairly well. He and his family are very much devoted to their homeland, Latvia. His rank in the army was Senior Lieutenant. He drinks alcoholic beverages very rarely and with moderation.

FELIKS AUSEKLIS, about 52 or 53 years old. Latvian, born and raised of in Vidzeme graduated from the Cesvaine Secondary School (about 1927).

In 1931 he graduated from the Latvian Military School; he then served in the 4th Valmiera Infantry Regiment (in Riga), and during the last years of independence he was assistant of a group supervisor in the Latvian Military School. During the Russian occupation period (1940-41) he was active in the underground movement and was wounded while taking part in partisan fighting in Vidzeme. (He has a scar on the palm of one hand). He took part in World War II as a member of the Latvian Legion and remained in Kurzeme after the capitulation. Now living in Riga. Works as an engineer in the "Dzirnavnieks" Plant. His wife, Valda, died about a year ago.

There are two daughters in the family, both of whom are studying in Latvia.

There is some suspicion that the British Services were trying to establish contact with him in the 1950ies. One of their employees managed to receive a short letter from F.A. I was asked to identify F.A.'s hand-writing. The British Service employee in question was Mr. S. Silarajs; his address at that time was 61, Mackenzie Rd., Beckenham, Kent, England. Mr. S.S. was in the Latvian Legion during World War II, serving in an aviation group as a lieutenant. I do not know any particulars, but I was told at one time that he is now working for some British Service.

Character description: Quiet, easy to get along with, intelligent, very active. Drinks hardly any alcohol. Had good connections among the

Latvian intelligentsia in Riga. Definitely anti-Communist.

I once received a short letter with greetings from him (about 3 years ago). I also wrote to him. The letters were forwarded via Sweden; I do not know in what manner.

His army rank was Captain.

JEKABS SILIS, about 57 or 58 years old. Born and raised in Latvia. Studied mechanics at the Latvian University. In 1931, he graduated very successfully from the Latvian Military School. During the Latvian independence period he served in the 5th Cesis Infantry Regiment and in a signal company of the Vidzeme Division (in Riga). He specialized in the communications service. During World War II, he served in the Latvian Legion; his last service post was in Lt Col Reberg's combat group. He was adjutant to the commander. He was taken prisoner by the Russians on the Hela Peninsula, 9 May 1945. In the fall of that year he was deported to Ukhta, Komi ASSR. He was released at the end of 1946 and returned to Latvia. After some time (following his return from the USSR) he began to work and is still employed in Riga, in the field of radio engineering (as an inspector). He lives in Riga, Tornakalns, in his former home (Altonovas iela 85). He does not want to have any mail sent to him at this address, or to have anyone visit him there. His mailing address is: c/o Erika Svarcs, K. Marksa iela 10/12, dz. 2. It would not even be advisable to send letters from abroad to this address, i.e. letters sent through the regular mail.

His parents are both dead; he lives with his wife and two sons. One of the sons is a student, the other one is employed as an electrician.
